

19th Century Autocorrect

Morse code was extremely popular and important during telegraph era. It is a method of transmitting messages using a language made of dots and dashes. Hog morse, whose nickname is the title of the puzzle, was the tendency of inexperienced operators to make errors while sending or receiving morse code. Examples below are some examples of such errors with comments hinting what went wrong. (none of the examples use numbers or punctuation marks and *space* indicates beginning of a new word)
